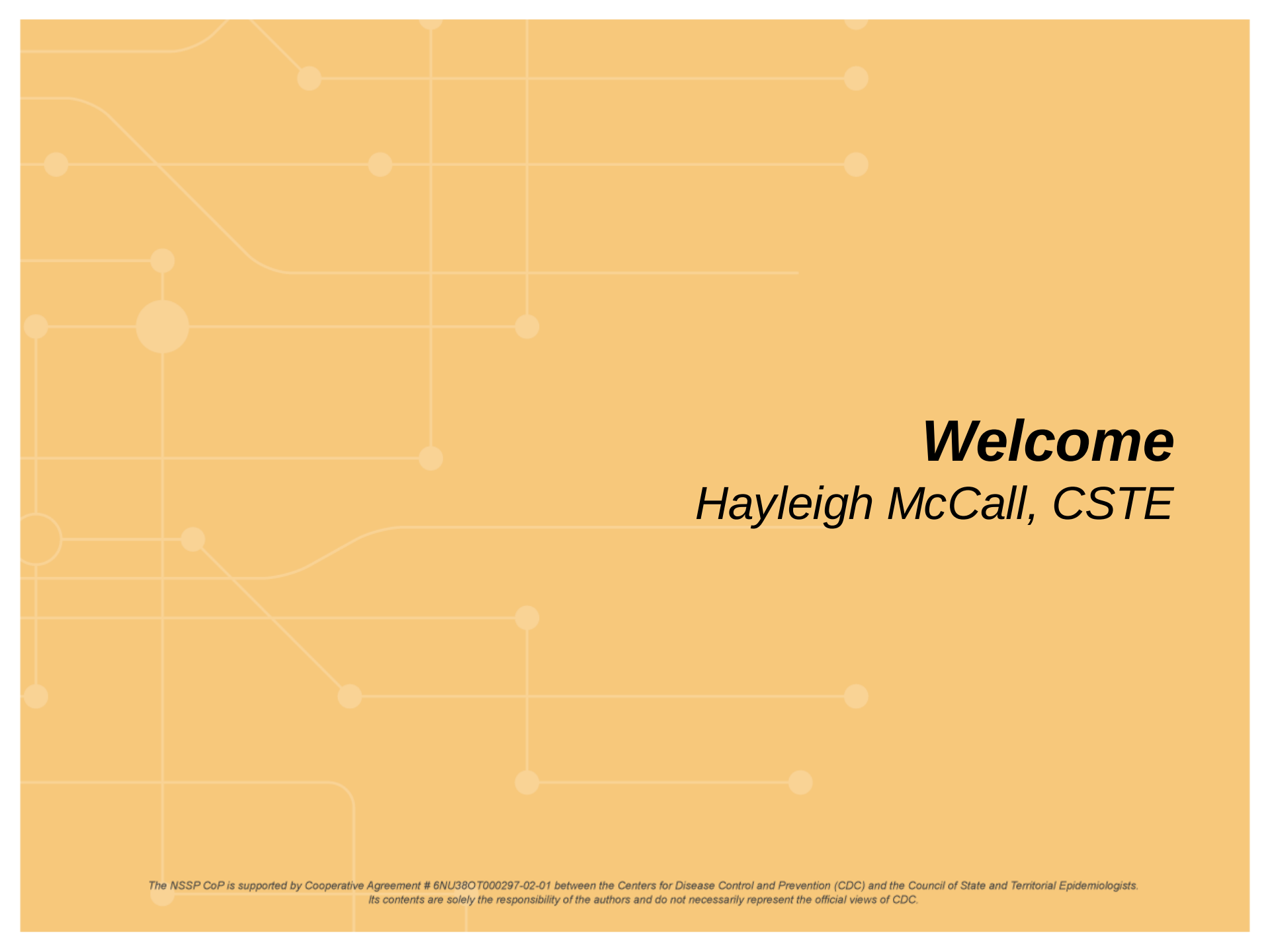

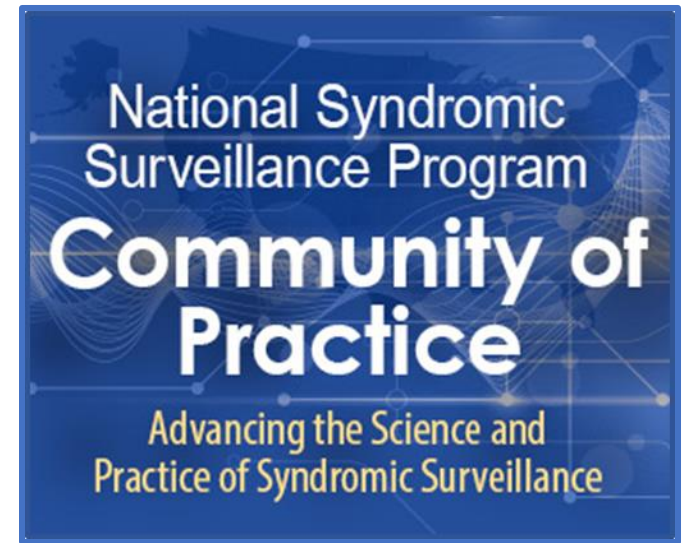

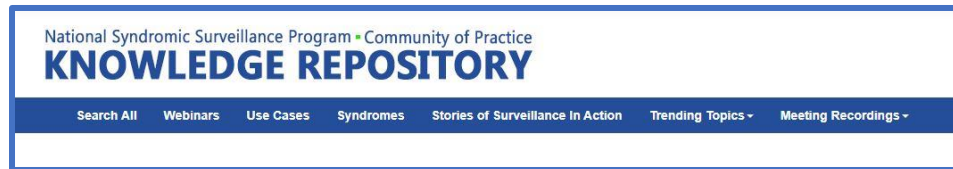

At no time will this space be used to communicate to or with members of the public

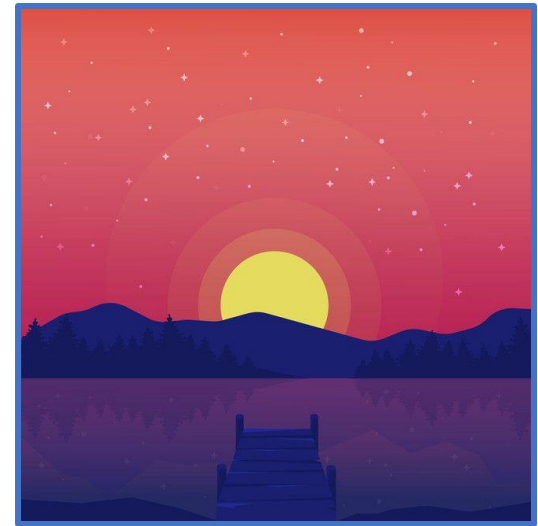


Subcommittee Updates

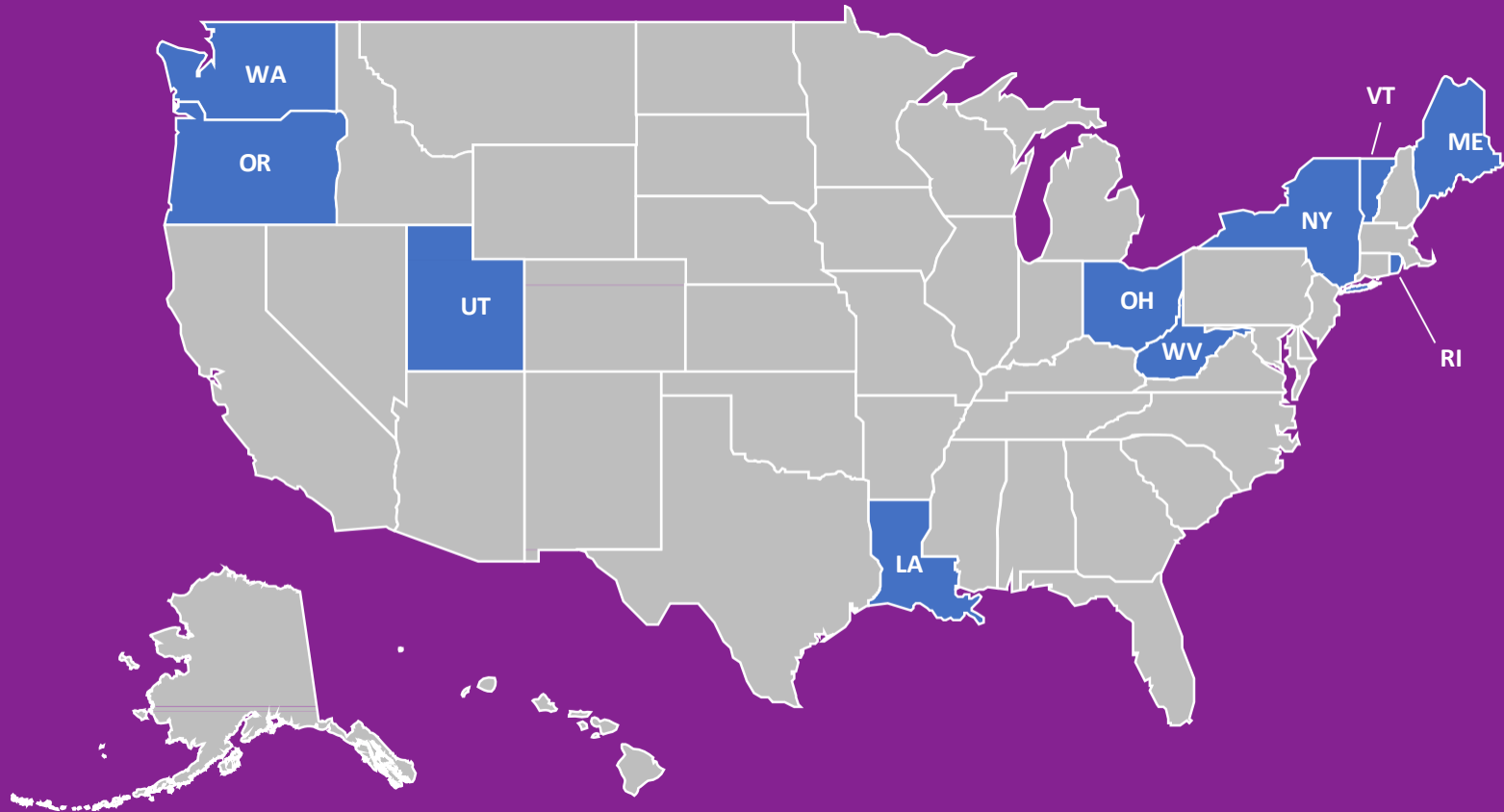
ED-SNRO Program Overview

- **Emergency Department Surveillance of Nonfatal Suicide Related Outcomes (ED-SNSRO)**
 - 3-Year Cooperative Agreement, 4.4+ Million, and 10-state funded program
 - Louisiana, Maine, New York, Ohio, Oregon, Rhode Island, Utah, Vermont, Washington, and West Virginia
 - Note: Throughout the project period, CDC will continue the award based on the availability of funds.
- **Objective:** This CDC Cooperative Agreement seeks to enhance local surveillance of nonfatal suicide-related outcomes by funding states to:
 - Strategy 1) increase the timeliness of aggregate reporting of nonfatal suicide-related outcomes
 - Strategy 2) disseminate surveillance findings to key stakeholders working to prevent suicide
- **Nonfatal Suicide Related Outcomes**
 - SDC Suicide V1
 - CDC Suicidal Ideation V1
 - CDC Suicide Attempt V1
 - Intentional Opioid Overdose (*reporting on hold*)

ED-SNSRO Recipients' Key Stakeholders

- Recipients' Key Stakeholders include:
 - Individuals, partners, or organizations working to prevent or respond to suicides in the recipient's state
 - The public
- Recipients' Key Stakeholders Outcomes:
 - Will receive timely information about trends in nonfatal suicide-related outcomes.
 - Will receive timely information about geographically-specific trends in nonfatal suicide-related outcomes.
 - Will be able to use syndromic surveillance to develop plans for focusing prevention strategies on populations at greatest risk of nonfatal suicide-related outcomes.

ED-SNSRO Funded Recipients



Syndromic Surveillance Definitions Included in Program Quarterly Data Submissions

SDC Suicide Related (V1)*	• Definition is currently incorporated into ESSENCE as a CCDD Category; includes suicidal ideation and suicidal and non-suicidal self-directed violence.
CDC Suicidal Ideation (V1)*	• Defined as thoughts of or plans in engaging in suicide-related behavior.
CDC Suicide Attempt (V1)*	• Defined as a nonfatal self-directed potentially injurious behavior with any intent to die as a result of the behavior. A suicide attempt may or may not result in injury.

Data for the Intentional Opioid Overdose syndrome definitions have not been included in data submissions, due to issues with the definitions. Once improvements are made and additional feedback from states are incorporated, CDC will work with each individual state to conduct the data pull for these definitions spanning the July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2020 dates.

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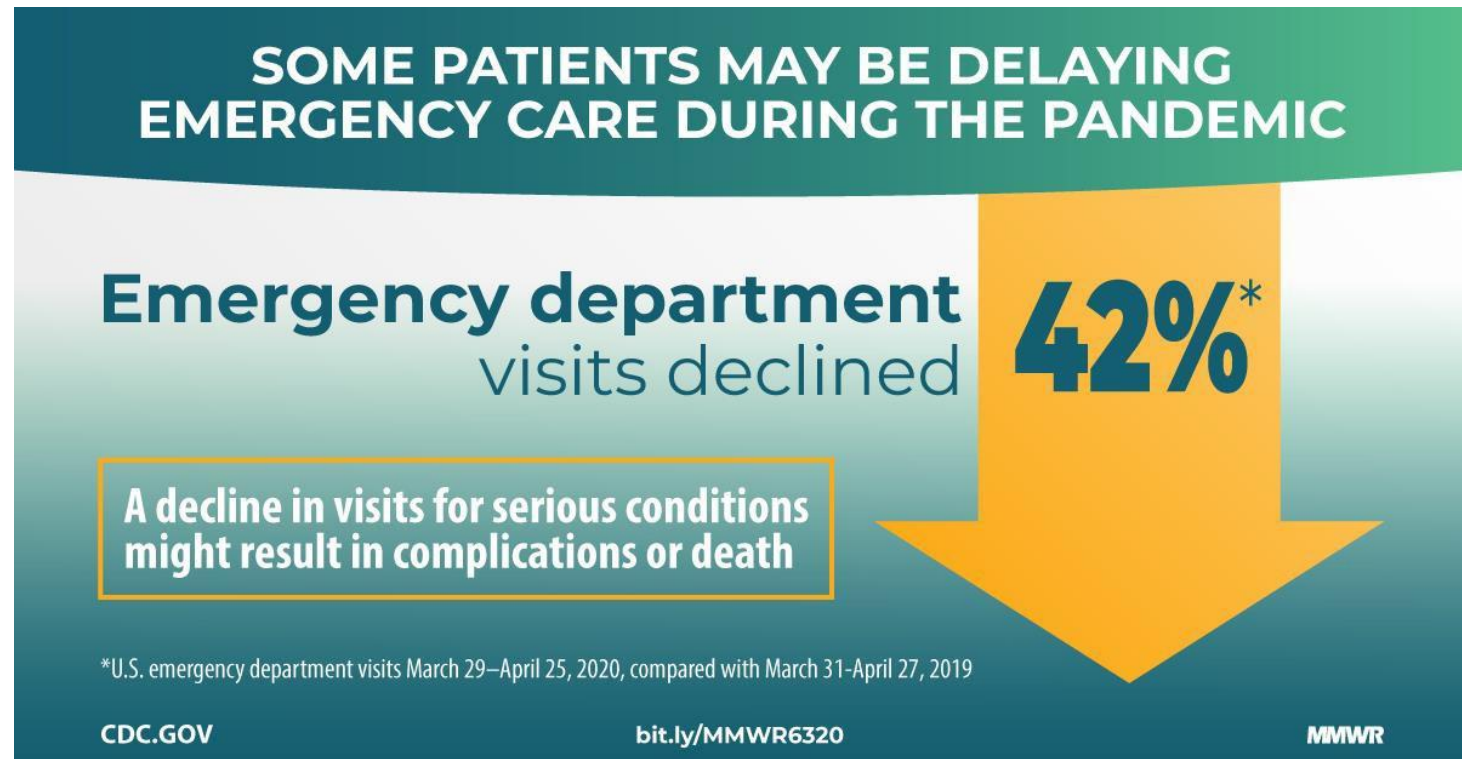
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CDC Suicide Attempt (v1) Syndrome Definition – ESSENCE Query

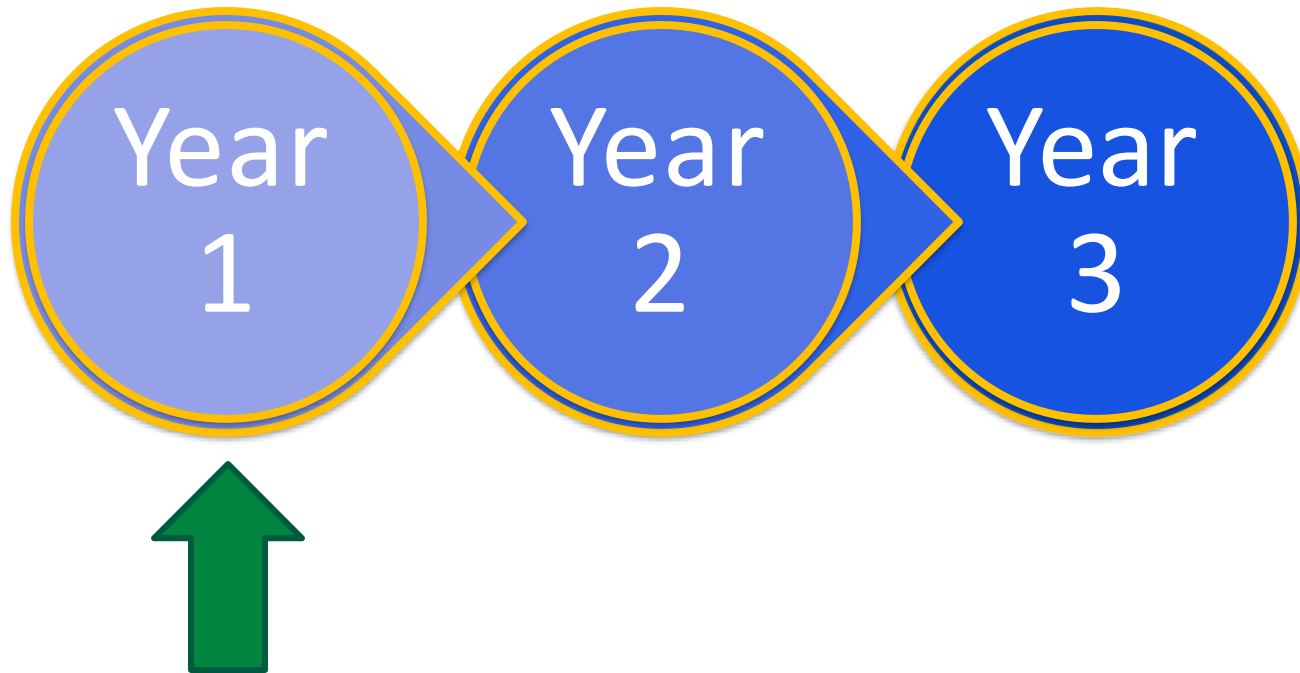
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CDC MMWR: Impact of the COVID-19 Pandemic on Emergency Department Visits – United States, January 1, 2019 – May 30, 2020

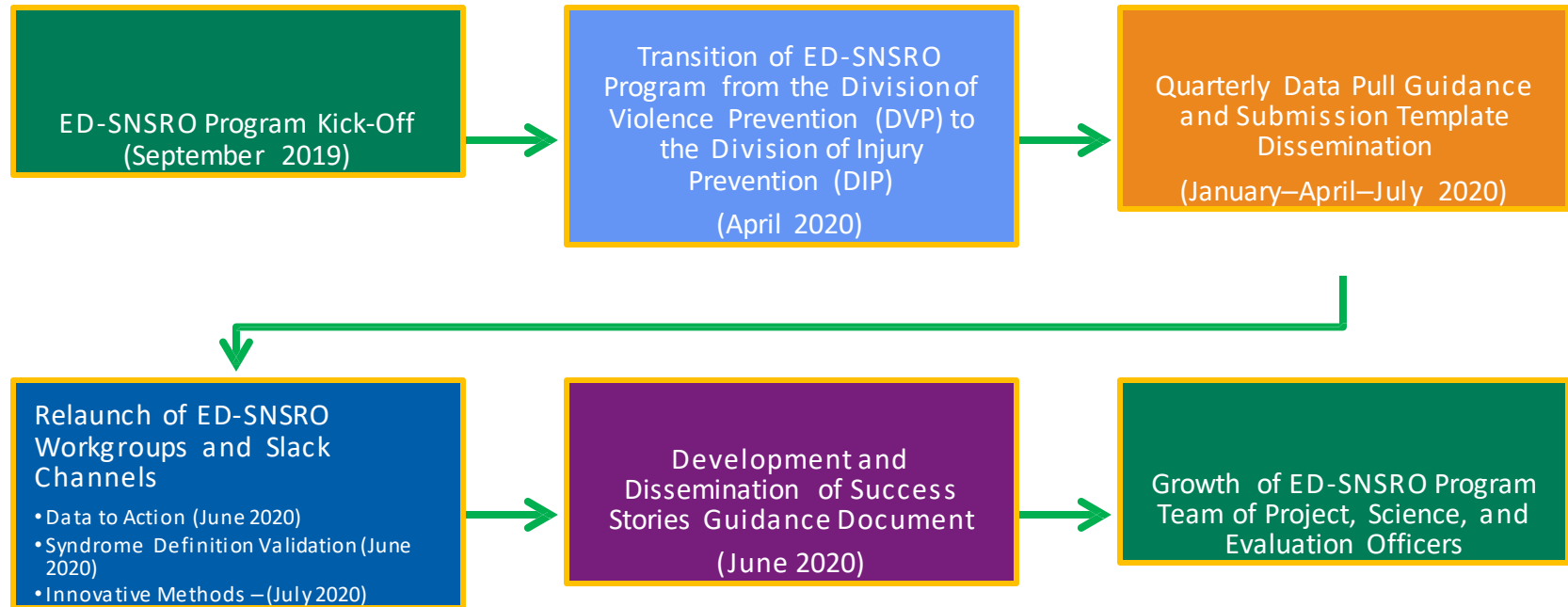

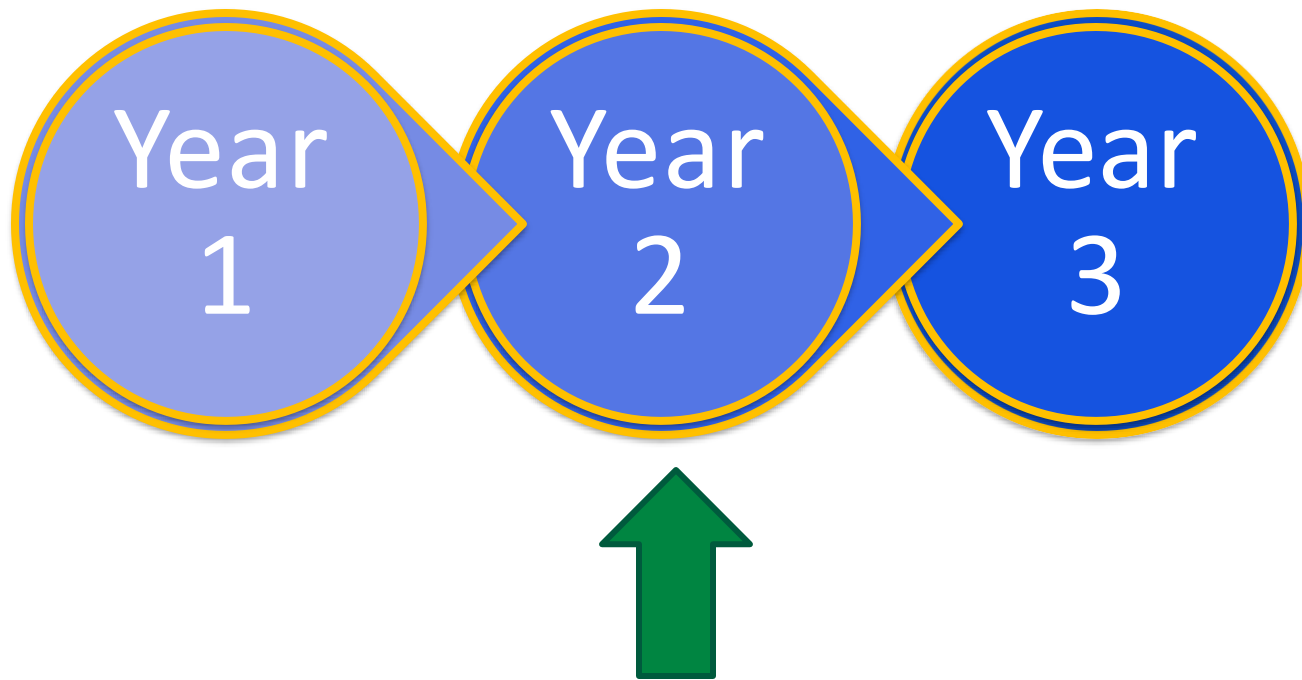

 - Potentially revise CDC Suicide Attempt Syndrome Definition – V1
 - Launch the reporting of Intentional Opioid Overdose Syndrome
 - Revise additional nonfatal suicide-related outcomes as needed

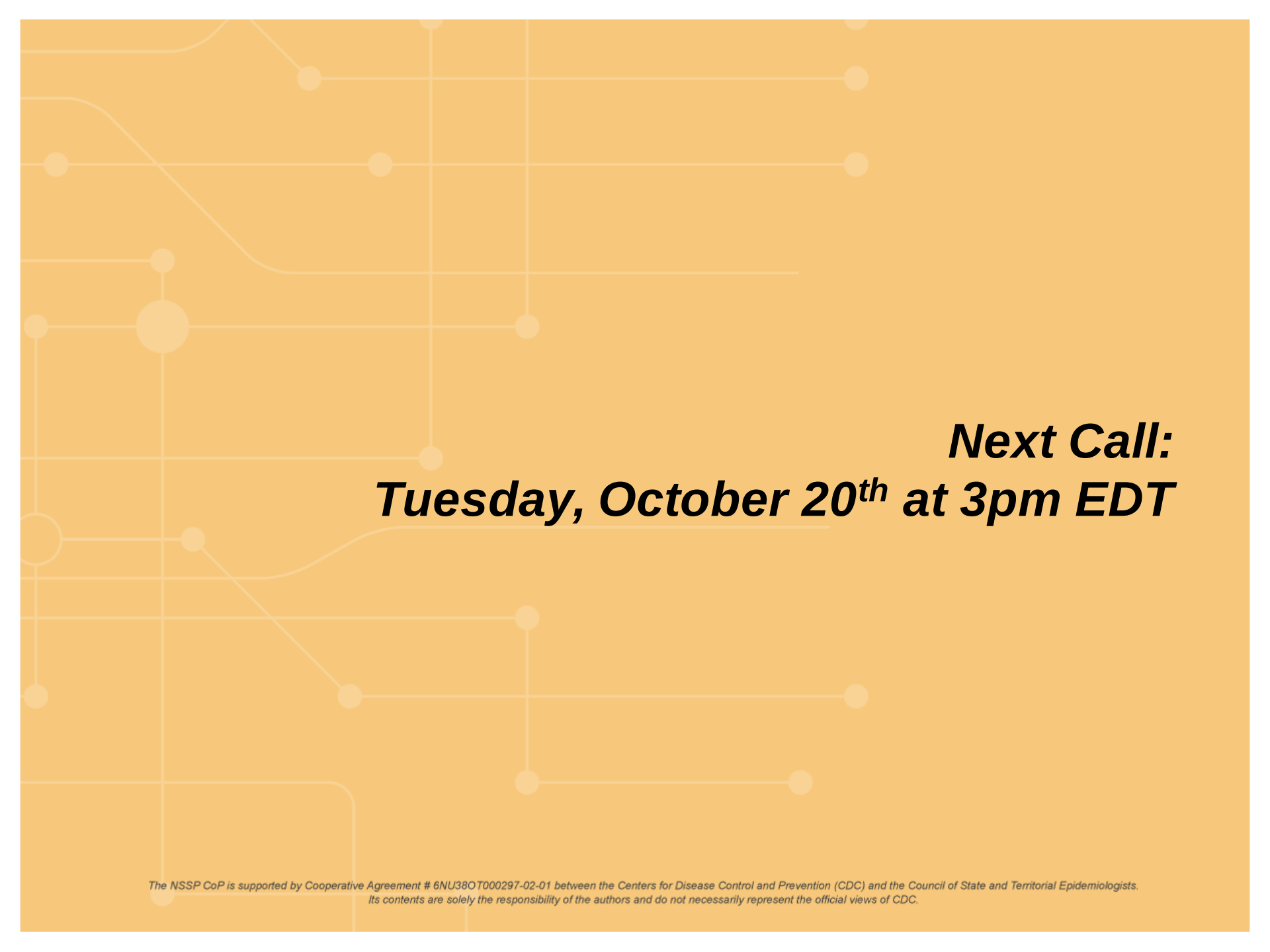
